- Attended Sussex Co Evacuation Workshop on April 27 at Del Tech. The purpose of this workshop was to strengthen coordination between State-County-Local authorities ahead of the release of new evacuation zones for the State of Delaware. The Delaware Emergency Management Agency (DEMA) partnered with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and Sussex County Emergency Operations to reevaluate the state's evacuation zones considering recent population growth and land use trends. DEMA is preparing a Know Your Zone public information campaign to disseminate information about evacuation zones. In anticipation of this and the start of the 2023 hurricane season, DEMA, Sussex County EOC, and Delaware Sea Grant organized this workshop to bring state-county-and municipal organizations together to review evacuation procedures, public outreach efforts, and ways to strengthen coordination between all entities.
