KNOW YOUR ZONE

It's important to know your Evacuation Zone before a disaster strikes. Did you know that South Bethany is in the "A" zone? Your zone includes specific evacuation routes for your area and proper guidance in the event of an emergency. During an emergency event, Delaware officials use the letter associated with the affected Evacuation Zones when issuing a warning or order. If you haven't already, this is also a great time to sign up for emergency alerts through the Delaware Emergency Notification System (DENS). Visit smart911.com to sign up.

NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION - PLAN AHEAD!

The Department of Transportation notified the Town that there is a proposed pavement and rehabilitation improvements project planned for Muddy Neck Road/Kent Avenue. Construction is anticipated to start summer 2023. Work will be performed between 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM with an expected duration of 120 calendar days.

SUMMER SAFETY

We can't say enough about summer safety! Not only is it important for motorists to be cognizant of pedestrians and bicyclists, but it's important for pedestrians and bicyclists to be cognizant of motorists! We remind pedestrians and bicyclists to stay to the sides of the road when walking or riding, as they are still traveled heavily by vehicles. Pedestrians should always use crosswalks when crossing Coastal Highway. Never take a chance. Cross Safely!

PETS

While it is widely known that the Town is very pet-friendly, it's important to remember that all dogs must be leashed in the Town's corporate limits. Dog bag stations and waste containers are located throughout Town and owners are responsible for the removal of dog waste. Please keep our Town clean & safe!

Dogs are not permitted on the beach at any time from May 15 through October 15.



SHOULD I STOP?

We see continual issues with the 3-way stop at Evergreen, Russell, and Peterson Roads. These are not yield signs. They are stop signs. Which means that all vehicles need to come to a complete stop. There is also an additional stop sign heading east



on Evergreen at Russell. Don't take chances! There are too many pedestrians and bicyclists right now. All vehicles must **STOP!**

PARKING TICKETS

Our parking enforcement officers are already busy this season. Parking permits are required in the Town for residents, as well as guests/visitors. Residential passes permit parking on the roads east of Coastal Highway and guest/visitor passes (purchased at the kiosk) permit parking on the roads west of Coastal Highway.

Have a problem or question about a ticket? Stop by the Police Department to dispute a ticket, not Town Hall. If you're paying for a parking ticket, go to Town Hall.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Community Relations Committee (CRC) was formed by the Town Council one year ago, the result of a merger of the former Communications & Public Relations and Community Enhancement Committees. The purpose of the CRC is to increase and enhance communication between the Town and property owners; to foster a sense of community and encourage residents' engagement and volunteerism; and to promote the stewardship of individual and Town-owned properties.

Spring has been a busy time for the CRC! Earlier this month we hosted a couple of well-attended programs inspired by Earth Day. At the first, entitled "Native Plants: What's the Buzz?", residents learned why native plants are critical to both ecological and human health and how we can incorporate them into our yards and gardens. Next, we hosted a presentation by Andrew McGowan of the Delaware Center for the Inland Bays on "Water Quality of the Inland Bays." The program included discussion of the recently released "State of the Bays" report which details water quality conditions in the three inland bays including the Little Assawoman Bay, to which our canals are linked. And, after two previous attempts that were flummoxed by rain, we finally hosted our second-ever community bonfire on the beach. It was a lovely night and we look forward to doing it again this fall.

Join us on the third Friday of each month at 10am in Town Hall for our monthly Coffee with Council program. This is an unstructured hour of casual conversation with a member of Town Council where attendees can share feedback and/or ask questions about any Town-related issue. Having been on hold for several months while Town Hall was renovated, we were pleased to resume this monthly program on May 19th with Mayor Saxton. The next will be

on June 16th with Councilman Bob Biciocchi.

We had a booth at the South Bethany Property Owners' Association (SBPOA) Summer Kick-off Party on June 10th, where we had more info on upcoming events and solicited your ideas for future events and community enhancement projects.

Mark your calendars for July 27th. The annual Movie on the Beach returns! This year we are traveling back to the 80s and showing a family-friendly classic comedy. Details will be forthcoming.
