Use Caution When Crossing Coastal Highway

The Bicycle & Pedestrian Safety Committee urges caution when crossing Coastal Highway to get to and from the beach. Please use the marked crosswalks always and the flashing beacons when possible, and *put your phone away while crossing!* Remember that motorists are NOT required to stop for the flashing yellow lights unless a pedestrian or cyclist is already in the crosswalk. When in the crosswalk, ensure traffic has stopped in both the inside and outside lanes before proceeding. Take the extra minute to be safe!

All Dogs Must be Leashed

We love seeing your dogs out and about town. However, to keep the public, your animal, and other animals safe, the Town staff and SBPD would like to remind all residents and visitors that a leash law is in effect in South Bethany. Town Code Chapter 30 prohibits all dogs—no matter how old or docile—off an owner's property without a leash.

If you wish to report an unleashed dog, please contact the South Bethany Police Department by calling 302-539-3996. Also, a reminder that no pets—leashed or not—are allowed on the beach from May 15th through October 15th.
