Community Resiliency Planning Update

The Town has hired planners from UD's Institute of Public Administration (IPA) to conduct a survey and to engage property owners in discussions about challenges and opportunities related to community resiliency. The survey, which closed on May 30 th, received 421 responses and the results will be shared soon. Opportunities for you to participate in the planning effort continue. On July 28th, we will hold an open meeting over Zoom on the topic of impervious surfaces. Specifically, we will discuss how those materials should be defined in the Town code and whether the permitted amount of such surfaces on individual properties should be reduced. Please Manage Your Recycling

Your cooperation is requested in following the rules for curbside recycling pickup. Please post the regulations (available on the Town website) in your home for any renters and/or guests.

- 1) NO PLASTIC BAGS, including garbage bags, should be placed in recycling bins.
- 2) BREAK DOWN your cardboard boxes or they will not be picked up.
- 3) Nothing left outside of your container will be picked up, so if it doesn't fit, save it for next time.
